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6.5 - Internal Quality Assurance System

6.5.1 Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes. It reviews teaching learning process, structures and methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals and records the incremental improvement in various activities.

IQAC is one of the major policy making and implementing units in our college. It strives hard for upgrading the college infrastructure and all support facilities to meet the standards of higher education and growing need of students. It assesses and suggests the parameters of quality education. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been established in our College at the instance of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure.

The IQAC Cell of our college works towards improving and maintaining the quality of education, by identifying and suggesting new ways of using teaching aids, developing suitable infrastructure, and offering suggestions for the start of new self-finance courses in the college. IQAC is an effective and efficient internal coordinating and monitoring mechanism. The IQAC meets twice in a year in order to plan, direct, implement and evaluate the teaching, research and publication activities in the College. The subcommittees dealing with various activities and departments implement the IQAC guidelines and report the feedback. Significant improvements in quality have been made by institutionalizing the following IQAC initiatives: Strategic planning of key areas and assigning responsibilities –

1. Academic and Administrative Audit through IQAC:

The college takes academic audit of the college, each department, office, library, hostel, and health centre every year through IQAC in order to increase and maintain the quality of education. As per the guidelines of the Karnatak University, Dharwad, the Principal prepares a list of experts consisting of 10-15 members and gets approval from the Vice-Chancellor and then, the Principal sets up a committee with three recommended experts to assess the academic and administrative matters of the college. The committee collects the academic plan and work done in each department, college office and other supporting units in the college, including publication, extension activity, collaborations, innovative and best practices, assignments, ICT based activity, student's competitions, seminars and workshops for better performance. The expert committee submits its evaluation report to the Principal and the IQAC. The same is placed before the HOD's, in a meeting called for discussion of the same, for suggestions and approval. IQAC, in turn strives to implement the suggestions made by the AAA committee in its report.

- As a result of implementation of suggestions made by the academic audit committee, it is found that all departments have been constantly improving their curricular, co-curricular, and research activities.
- ➤ The IQAC has submitted the AQAR report for the year 2021-22.


2. Use and enrichment of ICT infrastructure


The use of ICT tools has become an integral part in teaching -learning process. IQAC always encouraged teachers to utilize these tools in classroom teaching and laboratories. IQAC plans and encourages all the staff members to use and enrich the ICT facilities in each department. The IQAC monitors the periodical maintenance of ICT facility and its upgradation. All the staff members in the different departments of the college are provided with broadband internet and Wi-Fi facility. IQAC reaches out to all the students. IQAC advises the staff members to effective use of Social media like WhatsApp, YouTube, E-mail, text messages, Google forms, online classes etc., to educate as well as communicate with the students regarding their curricular and co-curricular activities, sharing of study materials. Feedback mechanism has been effectively implemented through online mode for the teachers, parents and students.

Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics) in the beginning of the odd semester, in order to introduce them to all the teachers of different departments, to give details about the courses offered, infrastructure facilities available, responsibilities of the students, code of conduct and disciplinary actions, different cells in the college to monitor the student's academic progression, medical facility, banking facility, NCC, NSS, gymkhana facilities, Students welfare and placements.

Outcome: Due to this best practice, the newly admitted students in the campus get authentic information about the infrastructure, departmental facilities, teaching and non-teaching staff of the college, as a consequence of which these facilities are easily accessed by the students.



6. Placement Drive:


IQAC proposed to conduct regular placement drives in the courses like BCA, B.Sc. (CS), and M.Sc (Physics).

7. Assessment of teacher's performance:

An effective feedback mechanism was adopted by IQAC to collect the students feedback about the teachers in the online mode (Google forms), focusing on different academic aspects. After analysis, the performance report of each individual teacher is represented in the graphical form, and the same is submitted in a sealed envelope to the Principal, with a request to serve the same to the teachers.

Outcome: Individual teacher comes to know about their academic performance, and this paves the way for an improvement in their future performance.

Incremental improvement in various activities

The IQAC constantly reviews and takes steps to improve the quality of the teaching-learning process. The Academic Calendar is prepared in advance, displayed and circulated in the Institute, and the same is strictly followed. Admission to various programmes, summer, winter and mid-term vacations, examination schedule and declaration of results are notified in the Academic Calendar. All the newly admitted students have to compulsorily attend the Induction Programme, in which they are made aware of the philosophy, the uniqueness of the Education system, the teaching learning process, the system of continuous evaluation, compulsory core courses, various co-curricular activities, discipline and culture of the Institute.

All students are also given a guided tour of the campus and the various facilities. Students are apprised of the Time-Table, Programme structure, and syllabi of the courses even before the semester commences. Important announcements are made in the morning assembly and attendance and conduct of classes are monitored by the Principal. Feedback from students is taken in virtual mode by IQAC. Students are also free to approach the Principal for feedback and suggestions. Feedback is properly analyzed and shared with the principal and staff members. The teaching-learning processes are reviewed and suggestions are implemented, based on the IQAC recommendations.

Implementation of suggestions made by the academic audit committee, it is found that all departments have been constantly improving their curricular, co-curricular, and research activities.

Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) Committee Visit, 27th December 2022

To

Karnatak Science College, Dharwad

(A Constituent College of Karnatak University, Dharwad)

A Report of AAA Committee

Karnatak Science College is a co-education constituent institution of Karnatak University, Dharwad. Dr. S. C. Chougale is its Principal and Dr. L. T. Nayak is the Coordinator of IQAC. The College comes under UGC 2f and 12(B). It was accredited for the third cycle in 2019 at 'B' Grade with CGPA of 2.22. The accreditation validity will end on 3rd March 2024. The IQAC was established in the year 2001 and an 18-member committee was formed. It appears that the committee did not propose strategies and goals to be achieved. However, there have been a number of programs/events, etc, conducted by the IQAC as per discussions at the meeting of the above said committee. The IQAC submitted AQAR for the year 2020-21.

The College offers BSc, BCA and BSc (Computer Science, CS) as Undergraduate programs with the following subjects for choosing combinations — Botany, Computer Science, Chemistry, Criminology/Forensic Science, Geography, Geology, Mathematics, Physics, Zoology, Statistics, Biotechnology, Microbiology and Genetics. The College also offers Self-financed Post-graduate MSc programs in Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics. As for BSc, BCA and BSc (CS), in all there are 27 courses offered under CBCS Scheme with the option of choosing Open Electives, thereby providing flexibility to the students. MSc programs are also offered under CBCS Scheme. There have been a total of 1856 students for the year 2020-21 with the students of BSc/BCA/BSc (CS) at the entry level account

for 579 and 104 for the three MSc programs based on the merit-cum-roster as per the State Government rules as and when notified by the Karnatak University. As a result, the students belonging to all social categories were proportionally represented in the enrolment. The Demand Ratios ~ 4.0, 3.0 and 1.0 stood respectively for BSc, BCA and BSc (CS) programs. The PhD programs are also offered in Botany, Zoology, Criminology/Forensic Science, Geology, Geography, Chemistry and Physics. To this end, the concerned individual teachers have secured grants of Rs. 92.02 lakh from under three MRPs and of Rs. 4.0 lakh under eight Minor Projects. Required research labs have been set-up and, when needed, concerned faculty members have been using instrumentation facilities at USIC, PURSE, UPE-FAR and SAIF programs established at Karnatak University. Out of 78 PhD registered candidates, 15 candidates have been on fellowship. Seven candidates were awarded the degree during 2020-21.

Observations and Commendations:

- 1. IQAC prepared the following Plan of Action:
- Demand ratio for BSc: 4.0 per vacancy; BCA: > 3.0 per vacancy; BSc (CS):
 1.0 per vacancy.
- 3. Passing percentage at aggregate level: For BSc 86; BCA 85; BSc (CS) –90. Similarly, for MSc (Chemistry) 88; MSc (Physics) 90; MSc (Maths) 92. While two students secured sixth and eighth ranks at BSc, one rank was secured at MSc (Chemistry).
- 4. There are 92 full-time teachers as against 43 sanctioned posts. Of these, the number of teachers with PhD is 55. The number of teachers recognized as research guides is 22.
- 5. The student-to-teacher is \sim 20:1. Similarly, the mentor-to-student (mentee) ratio is \sim 1:20.

- 6. There are adequate full-fledged 32 class rooms and seminar halls, 30 labs and 84 computer systems. Wherever required, accesses to some lecture rooms are provided by constructing ramps for the differently-abled persons. Respective laboratories are also well-equipped, ventilated and airy. The five museums (Botany, Zoology, Criminology/Forensic Science, Geology and Geography) have been an important part of the pedagogy and public outreach.
- 7. The syllabi were revised during the year 2020-21. However, curriculum enrichment is not apparent across all the 27 courses although it is claimed to have been incorporated but not shown in specific course papers from the syllabi.
- 8. The CBCS Scheme was implemented with effect from 2020-21, after a protracted delay.
- Conduct of exams, valuation and declaration of results has been completed
 as per Karnatak University norms/regulations. Redressal of the related
 issues/grievances have been conducted and resolved satisfactorily.
- 10. NCC/NSS Units have been active, engaging in a number of on-campus activities.
- 11. A number of specific waste management procedures have been adopted but not shown as data.
- 12. One MoU has been signed by the College with Nichrome Testing Laboratory and Research Pvt. Ltd., Dharwad.
- 13. Feedbacks have been collected and analyzed from all the stakeholders.

 However, no action reports have been mentioned in the AQAR report.
- 14. As for Teaching-Learning processes, there have been a number of events conducted but not available in data form to support it.

- 15. Program Outcomes (PO) and Course Outcomes (CO) have been provided in the syllabi but are too generic to be useful.
- Total research grant received at the individual level is ~ Rs 65.00 lakh.
 There two departmental level research projects.
- 17. Number of research papers published in International journals 104; National journals 11; Book chapters, 01. Number of collaborations is 05.
- 18. Number of extension/outreach programs conducted is 38.
- 19. Augmentation/renovation of the existing physical infrastructure (i.e., class rooms, library, labs, etc) has been carried out at a cost of Rs.138.85 lakh.
- 20. Rs.1.44 lakh has been utilized towards the purchase of books, periodicals, subscription to journals, etc, by the Central Library.
- 21. While 243 students benefitted by the scholarships provided by the government, whereas the 15 students benefitted by the NGOs, etc.
- 22. While 11 students have passed national/international level tests (i.e., KSET/NET/GATE/GRE), etc, but there is no break-up of the data to support it. Similarly, there is no accurate data to support their progression to higher studies and placements.
- 23. Except two ranks at BSc and one rank at MSc (Chem), hardly any awards, medals or any other recognition have been earned by the students; this may be seen as a reflection of the absence of the motivation and competitive spirit in them.
- 24. Much needs to be done in the over-all administrative machinery to implement e-governance with minimum delay. Further, the College will pursue Karnatak University to provide financial support to the needy teachers for attending the conferences, etc, and training for the office staff to make them computer-literate.

25. All the things considered, the College has performed very satisfactorily in all categories, namely, Curricular Aspects, Teaching-Learning and Evaluation, Research (both in terms of output and securing grants from the funding agencies), Extension, Infrastructure augmentation, Students Support Services and Progression, Governance, Institutional Values and Best Practices, and therefore, AAA Committee compliments all the students, teachers, the Principal, the IQAC Coordinator, non-teaching staff and all the concerned stakeholders.

Recommendations:

In the light of the above Observations and Commendations, the Committee wishes to make the following Recommendations:

- 1. IQAC will ensure that the 18-member committee constituted from the beginning proposes clear-cut strategies and quantitative metrics as achievable goals. One Deputy Coordinator may be nominated to ease pressure on the Coordinator as has been done at KUD. Further, required guidance may be sought from the IQAC at KUD.
- 2. The transfer of the teaching faculty belonging to Mathematics presently in the Karnatak Arts College will be expedited before 2024.
- 3. To recruit adequate number of teachers for all the departments including those where additional subjects are offered, namely, Biotechnology, Microbiology and Genetics, it is appropriate to show them as independent entities for proper deployment and filling of sanctioned posts. In this matter the College will take necessary steps to persuade Karnatak University.
- 4. Of the two Best Practices claimed by the College, namely, 'Mentoring System' and 'Solid Waste Management', the latter alone would qualify as

- the 'Best Practice' whereas the former practice is the part and parcel of the 'Teaching-Learning' process.
- 5. The existing Alumni Association to be strengthened so as to become integral part in the development of the College with new programs.
- 6. Since the fourth cycle of assessment and accreditation by the NAAC is due in 2024, IQAC will strictly comply with the requirements of AQAR to create year-wise quantitative data, documents, committee minutes and so on, and collate the same for consolidation and usage in the preparation of SSR and its successful submission. Both IQAC and the College would strive to earn a minimum of 'A' Grade that is richly deserved by the College.
